

Bruce Mueller Biosketch

Bruce A. Mueller is Professor and Interim Dean at the University of Michigan College of Pharmacy.

Dr. Mueller received his BS in Pharmacy from the University of Wisconsin and PharmD and residency training at the University of Texas. During his academic career, he has led a multidisciplinary clinical and laboratory research focusing on nutrition and pharmacotherapy in patients with kidney failure. He has published over 150 peer-reviewed scientific papers that have focused on how to effectively treat patients receiving dialysis therapies in the inpatient and outpatient settings. He and his teams of colleagues and trainees have led dozens of trials investigating new and existing drugs with the primary purpose of finding optimal doses to quantify the extent of drug removal by dialysis therapies.

While Dr. Mueller is also an accomplished educator and mentor. He was named Best Faculty Educator while at Purdue University in 1997 and was the recipient of the University of Michigan Teaching Excellence Award in 2011. In recognition for his decades of mentoring professional and graduate students, as well as post-doctoral fellows in his laboratory, he received the 2015 University of Michigan Institute for Clinical & Health Research Distinguished Clinical and Translational Research Mentor Award. In recognition for his contributions, Dr. Mueller has been named a Fellow of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy, American Society of Nephrology, and the National Kidney Foundation.
